A Letter from the President—2018 Annual Report

There's a lot to celebrate this year so let's get to it, starting with the statistics that always raise eyebrows. These impressive numbers have improved even more in the past year. The high school graduation rate for club members is now at 95%, compared to a national average of 70%. Eighty-six percent of club members expect to attend college, and 90% are not involved with the Juvenile Justice System.

From a group of seven boys in 1936, the Boys & Girls Clubs of Schenectady has grown to become the leading youth agency in our county. Our club members miss less school and better abstain from tobacco and drug use. They have safe places to go—clubhouses, schools, parks, pools and summer camps. Thousands more benefit from our community outreach programs. Because we've grown to serve more than 12,000 children and teens at 18 sites and extensions, we need more room. In 2018 we broke ground on a new home facility and it's going up fast. Designed with direct input from club members, our new facility expects to triple the number of youth we serve. The new 39,450-square-foot building in Quackenbush Park is scheduled for completion this year. It includes a teen center, commercial learning kitchen, game rooms, technology centers, program rooms, spacious gymnasium, and a theater for performing arts that was designed with the help of Proctors Theatre.

It's all the result of the Building Great Futures for Schenectady's Youth Campaign and is being funded by private and public donations to benefit local children- more so than ever before for youth development in the history of the City of Schenectady. The new building sends a clear message to club members that this community cares about them and their success.

The keys to success are high self-esteem and high expectations, so here's another number: 94% of club members believe the club staff have high expectations of them. This number is sometimes overlooked, but it's a real measure of how club members feel about themselves, their community, and their futures.

About Us

Boys & Girls Clubs of Schenectady is the largest agency provider of services to the youth who need us most in Schenectady County, serving 3,320 members and reaching more than 12,000 total youth in 2018.

We serve youth ages 6 to 18 in our four clubhouses at Mont Pleasant, Rotterdam, Steinmetz Homes and Yates Village. Other programs include Job Junction and seven after-school programs at Schenectady High School, Central Park Middle School, Mont Pleasant Middle School, Oneida Middle School, Keane Elementary School, Lincoln Elementary School, Martin Luther King Elementary School and the Steinmetz Career and Learning Academy.

Boys & Girls Clubs of Schenectady owns and operates Camp Lovejoy, a wildly popular summer day camp in Altamont and the Summer Program at the Rotterdam Club (SPARC). We operate summer programs for the City of Schenectady at Quackenbush Park, Hillhurst Park, Steinmetz Park, Front Street Park and Central Park, including all four city swimming pools.

We offer a broad range of programs in five core areas:

- Character & Leadership Development
- Health & Life Skills
- The Arts & Sports
- Fitness & Recreation

One misunderstanding regarding our relationship with BGCA is that it provides a great deal of funding to our organization. In reality, less than 3% of our annual budget comes directly from BGCA. Our relationship is primarily predicated on access to expertise, quality programming and branding that instills confidence in our customers and supporters.



The Boys & Girls Club Experience Provides Wonderful Outcomes for Our Members

As the Boys & Girls Clubs of Schenectady strives to achieve a greater impact for our young people, we work tirelessly at bringing the outcome-driven club experience to life. As part of the National Youth Outcomes Initiative (NYOI) through Boys & Girls Clubs of America, our organization focuses primarily on three areas that have been identified as critical to helping young people develop. They are:

Academic Success Good Character & Leadership Healthy Lifestyles

The NYOI is the largest gathering of youth development data in the United States. We are proud to be part of this initiative as it helps us identify where we are doing great with our young people as well as areas we need to strategize for improvements.

NYOI highlights for 2018 include:

Academic Success

94% of our youth are on grade level for their age.

91% (ages 9-18 years old) expect to graduate from high school (National average is 65-70%).

83% report missing three days or fewer during a full school year.

86% report an expectation to attend college.

Good Character & Citizenship

92% report they have developed leadership skills.

90% have not been arrested or involved with the juvenile justice system.

89% report civic responsibility and concern for their community.

92% have set goals for their future.

Healthy Lifestyles

90% are engaged in physical activity at the Club.

98% abstained from all tobacco products.

96% abstain from the use of illicit use of prescription drugs.

The Overall Club Experience

94% of members believe that Club staff have high expectations for them.



The Boys & Girls Clubs of Schenectady is proud to introduce Thalia Maynor, the 2018-2019 Youth of the Year. Thalia is a junior at Schenectady High School and has been a member of the Steinmetz Boys & Girls Club since she was six-years old. Two words that best describe Thalia are dedication and hard working. While spending over 100 hours volunteering at the Club and in her community in 2018, Thalia was also able to achieve stellar grades and play two high school sports.

Thalia is part of the accelerated International Baccalaureate Program at Schenectady High School taking the most difficult courses offered to students. She has a 3.2 average and ranks 58th in a class of 493 students. She also excels in athletics playing varsity and travel team Volleyball and Track & Field. Even with her busy school schedule, Thalia still attends the Club regularly.

At the Steinmetz Boys & Girls Club, Thalia serves as a Junior Staff member volunteer who works to help younger members with homework, develop their computer skills and leads them through various art projects. Additionally, she is an active member of the very important Real Talk program. Real Talk is a program of the Alliance of Positive Health for high-risk teens. This youth-led and youth-driven prevention program is designed to have a positive impact on reducing or eliminating potential risky behaviors teens may engage in.

The Boys & Girls Club has helped Thalia to find her voice and develop into a strong leader and role model for so many children. Over the years, the Club is where she has learned the importance of giving back to her community. She has been a staunch volunteer at Global Youth Service Day (since 2011), World AIDS Day (since 2015) and has been involved in several community service projects with her volleyball team and Baccalaureate Program in

school.

Thalia also credits the Club for helping her map out her future career path. While working with an engineer from RPI who was volunteering in the Club's STEM initiative, Thalia discovered the career she will be pursuing in the future. Her current goals are to attend the Rochester Institute of Technology and study Petroleum Engineering- the career she learned about during her time in the STEM program at the Club! With her pure drive and determination, it is safe to say we expect great things from Thalia Maynor.









Playground goes up at Steinmetz Thanks to KaBoom!, Foresters and over 200 volunteers!

On September 9th, more than 200 volunteers gathered at Steinmetz Homes to make history! Organized by KaBOOM! and financed primarily by Foresters Financial, a playground miraculously appeared in a location that badly needed outdoor recreation space for young people. After several months of planning, partners KaBoom!, Foresters, the Boys & Girls Club and the Schenectady Municipal Housing Authority- and all of those volunteers- spent the entire day moving, building, tightening and erecting a gorgeous playground for the children of Steinmetz Homes.

The design for the playground was based on drawings from local children during a special Design Day in July. Playground features include a tire swing, quattro see-saw, castle drawbridge, rock-blocks, balance buttons and more!

KaBOOM! Project Manager Sarah Branoff was a wonderful leader who helped keep the entire team moving forward during the project. It should be noted that although the playground went up in a day, there was 5 months of planning with special committees in place to help ensure all of the tasks where handled properly. This KaBOOM! implemented process helps guarantee a very smooth Build Day. An example of the amazing planning and leadership of Sarah Branoff occurred on September 7th (two days prior to the build) when 30 volunteers took part in Prep Day. Prep Day is vital as it helps organize all of the equipment, etc. so that when the 200 volunteers show up on Build Day, everything is ready to go! There was absolutely zero wasted time as Build Day started at 8:00AM and a completed playground was standing by 3:00PM.

"Having accessible, safe and inviting recreational space is critical to the development of young children," said Shane Bargy, Executive Director of the Boys & Girls Clubs of Schenectady. Kristen Kucij, the Boys & Girls Club Unit Director at Steinmetz stated, "This playground is important in many ways to the children here. They are thrilled that so many people really care about them."

"Bringing kids and parents together to put their ideas on paper and then watch their vision come to life in one day is just something amazing," said Richard Homenick, Executive Director of the Schenectady Municipal Housing Authority.

Foresters Financial is a KaBOOM! Founding Partner and National Partner. This was the 149th playground that Foresters has built with KaBoom! throughout the country. Assistant Vice President Jonathan Wilsey of Foresters was incredible as he helped with all aspects of the project including bringing in over 100 of his colleagues to volunteer on Build Day. Since 1996, KaBOOM! has been dedicated to ensuring that all kids get the balance and active play they need to thrive.





Rotterdam Clubhouse gets a major remodel thanks to Lowe's

On September 17th, the Boys & Girls Clubs of Schenectady unveiled the remodel of its Rotterdam Unit, thanks to a \$50,000 Renovation Across the Nation (RAN) grant and the Lowe's Heroes from 12 Lowe's stores in the Capital Region. The RAN grant was the only one awarded by Lowe's and Boys & Girls Clubs of America in New York State! Additionally, the 12 local Lowe's stores each made a \$2,500 dollar commitment to the renovation.

All of this support from Lowe's will help the club remain a safe and inviting place for Schenectady County youths. The Boys & Girls Clubs of Schenectady is proud to have been chosen as the lone New York State recipient of this generous RAN grant.

Renovations at the Rotterdam clubhouse included lots of painting, new ceilings and floors, masonry work, a large mural, furniture and fixtures, plumbing, and even a rock wall in the gymnasium. Improvements were made in many areas, including the education room, swimming pool, game room, learning kitchen, bathrooms, gymnasium, program rooms and art room. Impressively, the whole process took less than a month, from August 20th to September 14th. BBL Construction Services very generously donated the time to help manage the project and subcontractors that were brought in to assist. Several of the subcontractors also donated supplies and labor to expand the impact of the project.

BGCS Executive Director Shane Bargy said, "This is one of the most incredibly impactful projects we have ever seen in one of our locations. Lowe's, its employees and BBL have simply changed the way this building looks and functions. The impact will be felt for years."

Lowe's Niskayuna Store Manager Michael Wurst was instrumental in pulling the project together and helping secure the Lowe's Heroes who had over 50 volunteers helping complete several of the project spaces themselves. The club and the kids will never forget their generosity.















Construction Begins on New Facility!

In December 2018, a dream became reality when the Boys & Girls Club broke ground on its new 39,450 square foot youth development center in Quackenbush Park. After two years of raising the \$9.2 million dollars needed to construct the facility, the Boys & Girls Club was thrilled to see the project officially get underway.

As the construction roared into 2019, it has been amazing to see things moving so quickly while also encountering the most frigid temperatures imaginable. Contractor BBL and several subcontractors have worked tirelessly to keep the project on a strict timeline for a hopeful grand opening in October/ November 2019.

This project had been under consideration for over ten years. Shortly after the Boys & Girls Club started running the Quackenbush Park swimming pool for the City of Schenectady, it was suggested that a facility in the park would be a perfect way to serve more children from the Hamilton Hill & Mont Pleasant neighborhoods. Perfectly positioned in between Mont Pleasant Middle School, Pleasant Valley Elementary School and a block away from the Steinmetz Career and Learning Academy, it was clearly understood that a new facility would meet the needs of a large population of children and teens. In previous years it had become increasingly clear that the Craig St. facility that the Boys & Girls Club inhabited for over 40 years was a woefully inadequate platform for safe programming for the needs of the young people. Therefore, the decision was made to go forward with a design and strategy for raising the necessary dollars required to create a place that would effectively service the children of Schenectady for decades to come.

The state-of-the-art center, designed with Synthesis Architects, will have a Learning Center, two technology labs, a 4,000 square foot Teen Center with Café, two large game room areas, a performance theater with rehearsal space designed with Proctors, a commercial learning kitchen that will feed 300 young people daily, a rooftop garden, a video production room, a DJ/radio station and a large gymnasium designed to handle all of the young peoples' physical education needs as well as large special events. The facility was designed with safety at the forefront with strategic camera placement, a main artery hallway that doesn't cross program areas and safety through environmental design enabling club staff to be aware of what is happening just outside of the facility at all times.
































The Boys & Girls Clubs is so thankful that after two years, the Building Great Futures for Schenectady's Youth Campaign successfully achieved the financial goal for completing the construction of this amazing facility. The Wright Family Foundation and the Little Family Foundation each kicked off the campaign with \$2 million dollar pledges in 2017. In the months that followed these two incredible gifts, more than 100 individuals, foundations and corporations joined in to help get this project closer to its goal. In 2018, the Club was extremely fortunate to secure New Markets Tax Credits thanks to Empire State Development and The Community Builders who awarded the credits to this project as Community Development Entities. JPMorgan Chase then jumped in as a true believer in the project and became the Equity Investor. M&T Bank soon followed with a significant bridge loan. The final piece of the puzzle came from New York State Homes and Community Renewal who awarded the project the closing \$3 million required to officially make the project a reality. This project is one of the largest private/public investments in youth development in the history of the City of Schenectady.

While construction continues, the Boys & Girls Club is now working to raise critical dollars to help sustain the programing to take place in the new facility along with other club sites it operates in order to reach over 12,000 kids annually. The Club is so thankful to everyone who is committed to making this project a success for the children of Schenectady who need a new, safe place to learn, grow and have fun on a daily basis.




